The Kate Edger Educational Charitable Trust is named in recognition of Kate Milligan Edger who in 1877 became the first women in the British Empire and New Zealand to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts degree.

The Trust operates Academic Dress Hire and channels all proceeds made from hire back to students in the form of grants and awards.

In 1920 the Auckland Branch of the then Federation of University Women began.

The Trust, formed in 2005, traces its origins to 1951 when Dame Dorothy Winstone and others set up a regalia hire business.
